understanding and his **answers**.

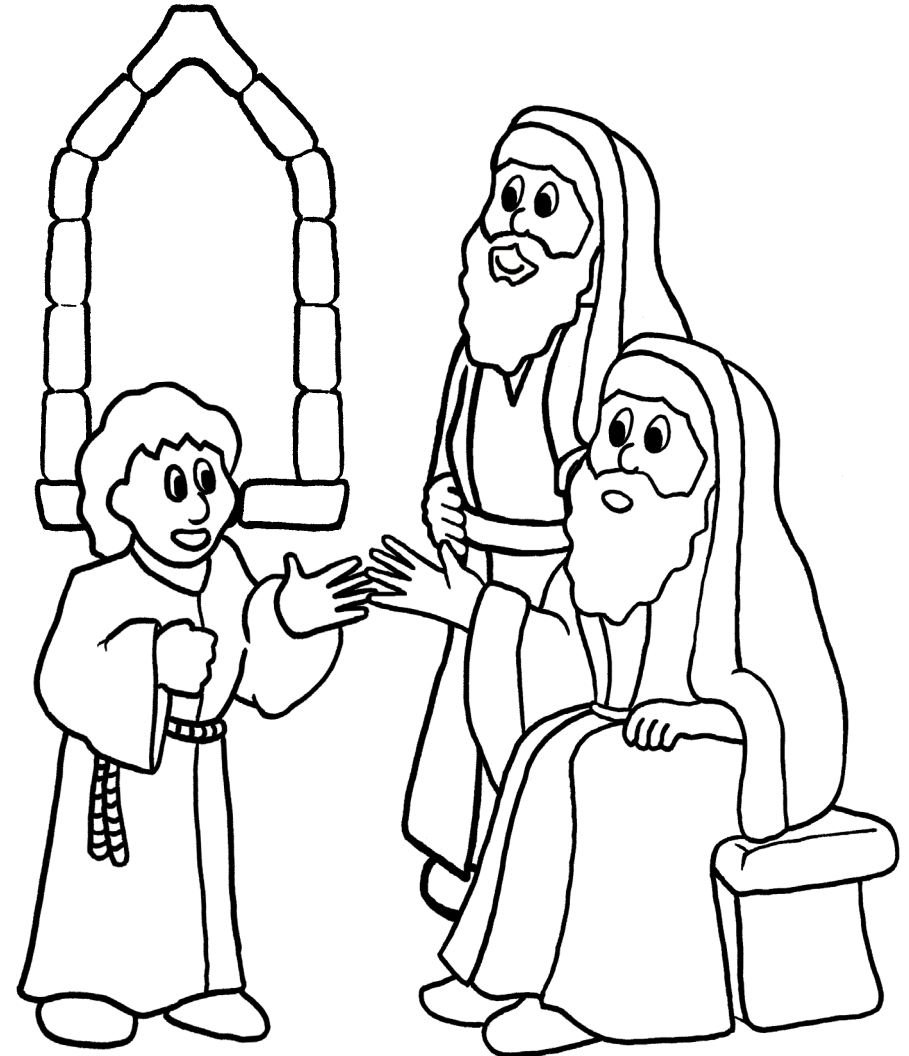

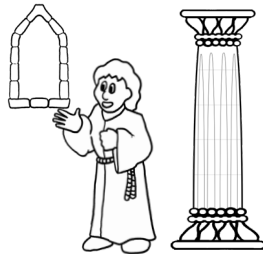
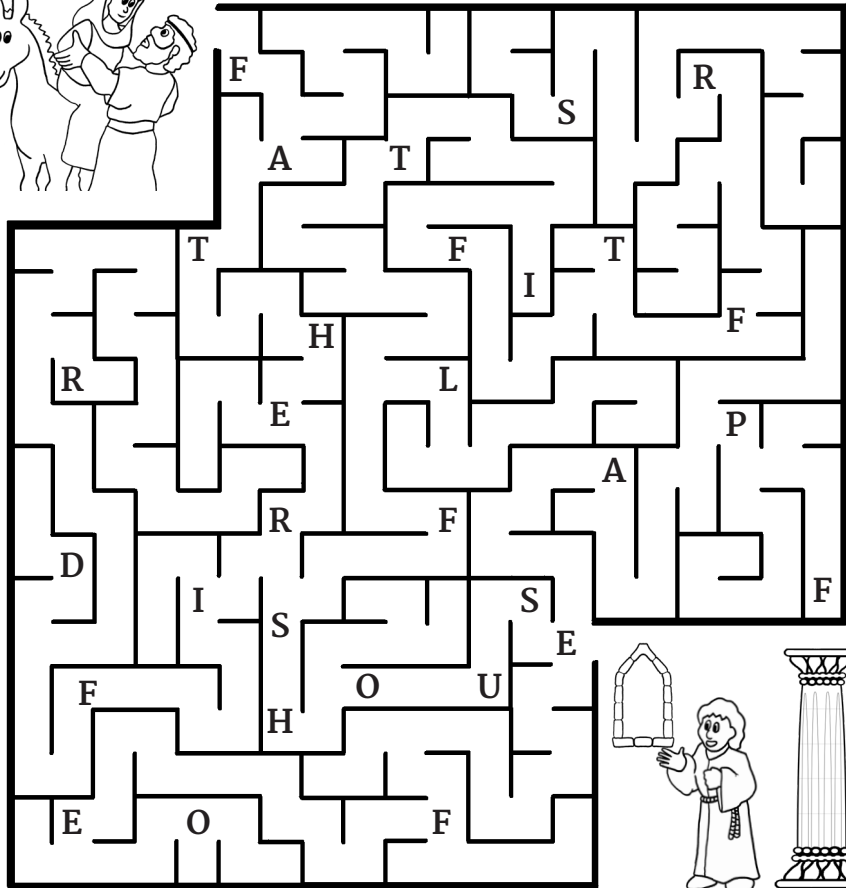
Mary and Joseph thought Jesus was lost.

Mary and Joseph are searching for young Jesus.

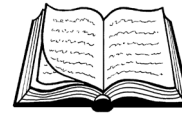
Lead them through the maze, picking up letter "clues" as you go, and writing the letters at the bottom of the page!
