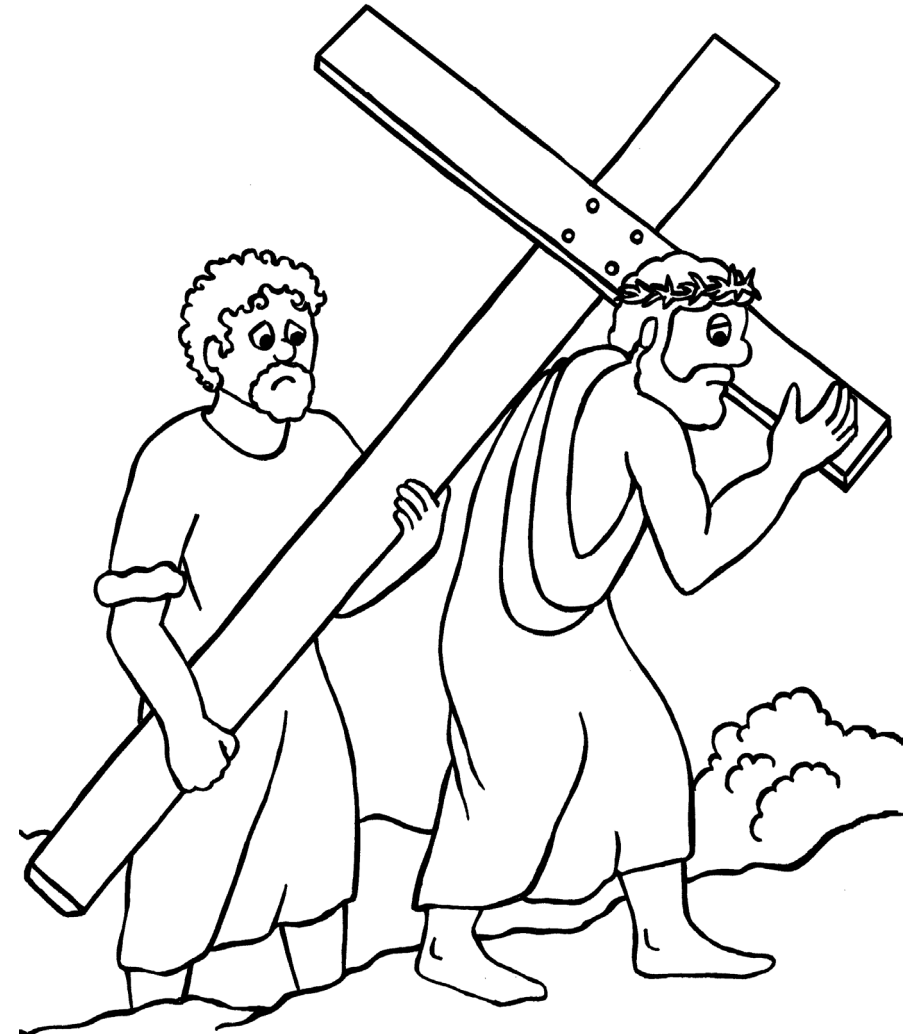

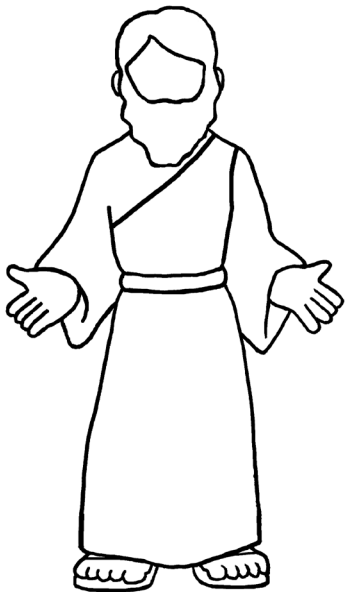


Being a disciple of Jesus means taking up our cross and following him.

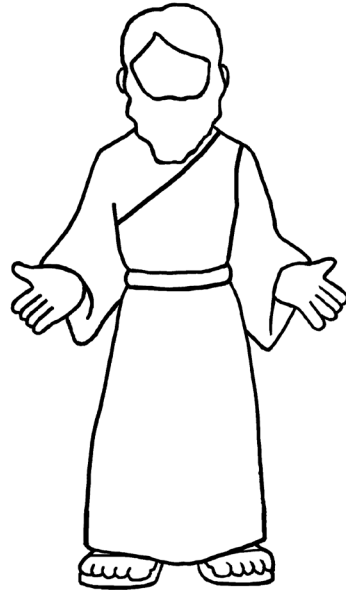
