



Martin Luther created a special seal for the new church to remind us of the beliefs we share.


Color the seal according to the directions.




- 1 = Gold. The outer ring is the color of precious metal.
- 2 = White. The flower petals are the color of peace.
- 3 = Green. The leaves are the color of new life.
- 4 = Red. The heart is the color of the saving blood of Jesus.
- 5 Blue. The area around the flower is the color of joy.

Martin Luther saw music as a good gift from God. He loved Psalm 46, and often sang it when he felt bad. In fact, he wrote a hymn based on that psalm, called, "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God." In this hymn, Luther says that God is like a fortress, protecting us from our enemy, the devil.
