<u>Listening for the Promise</u>

Weekly Devotional First Sunday in Lent - February 26, 2023

"Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. And after fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry." -Luke 4:1-2a

The season of Lent is a 40-day period of penitence and spiritual discipline during which we struggle against our sin and identify with Jesus as our savior from sin. The 40-day period commemorates Jesus' 40 days of fasting in the wilderness, ending in His temptation by Satan. During these 40 days, Jesus identified with us and overcame Satan for us. Therefore, in our Lenten struggle against sin, we must remember an important truth: It is Jesus' spiritual warfare that makes our spiritual warfare possible. Let's delve deeper into the significance of Jesus' spiritual trial.

First, Jesus' temptation in the wilderness reminds us of Adam's temptation in the Garden of Eden. However, while Adam failed under ideal circumstances, Jesus prevailed under extremely difficult circumstances (i.e., after a 40-day fast). Second, the 40 days of Jesus' temptation also remind us of the 40 years that Israel wandered in the wilderness. However, while many Israelites grumbled against God and failed their test, Jesus remained faithful to the end. Thus, Jesus' trial and victory shows us that He is both the Second Adam and the true Israel. As the second Adam, Jesus saves humanity both by doing what the first Adam should have done (by living righteously) and also by making up for what the first Adam did wrong (by going to the cross). As the true Israel, Jesus fulfills the covenant that God made with Israel in order to establish a new covenant with and for us.

Here we see that at the very beginning of Jesus' ministry, there were already undertones of the cross. This means that Jesus' earthly ministry was bracketed by trial and the cross. In fact, Jesus' temptation in the desert was the trial by which He proved Himself capable of going the distance against Satan. And as a prize for His victory, Jesus won the right to go to the cross for us in order to save us and free us for our own spiritual warfare! Jesus defeated Satan for us so that we could engage the battle.

During Lent, therefore, we do not struggle against sin to earn our salvation. Rather, we struggle because Jesus has already won the victory for us and has thereby freed us to struggle. Jesus' spiritual warfare makes our spiritual warfare possible. And He will catch us when we fall.

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
