I am the **good shepherd**. The good shepherd **lays down his life** for the **sheep**. He who is a **hired hand** and not a shepherd, who does not **own** the sheep, **sees** the **wolf coming** and **leaves** the sheep and **flees**, and the wolf **snatches** them and **scatters** them. He flees because he is a hired hand and **cares** nothing for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I **know** my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the **Father**; and I lay down my life for the sheep. And I have other sheep that are not of this **fold**. I must **bring** them also, and they will **listen** to my **voice**. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father **loves** me, because I lay down my life that I may **take** it up **again**. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own **accord**. I have **authority** to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This **charge** I have **received** from my Father.”

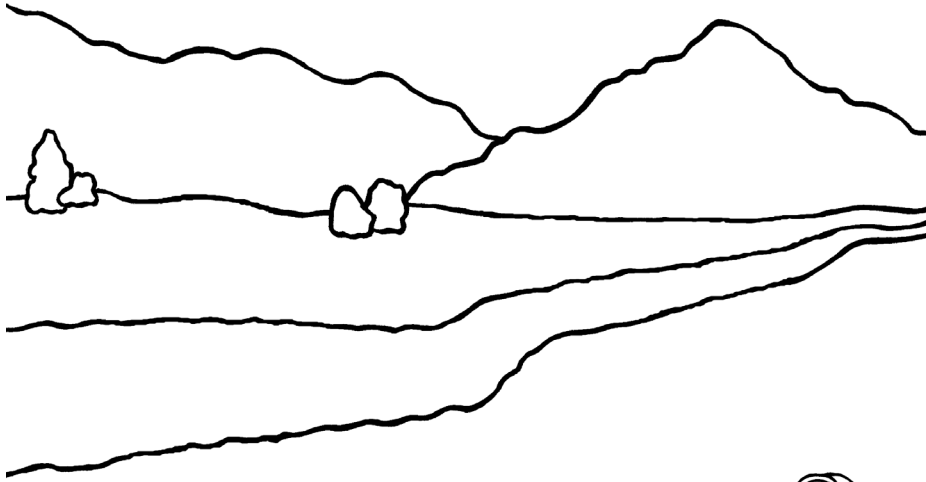

God loves you and watches over you every day, like a good shepherd would do. You can rest in His care!

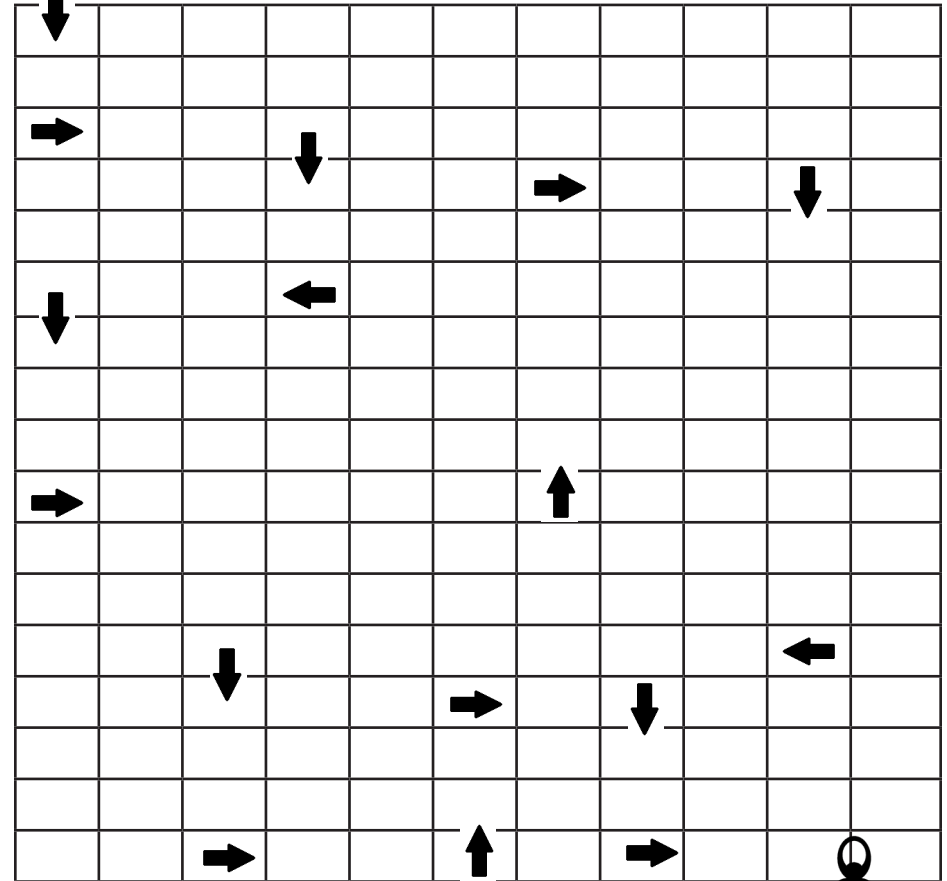
Look at the pasture below. Draw yourself and your family beside the Good Shepherd. Then, color the picture!
