#### **▲** CONFESSION

All of us are born into this world with a deep need for baptism: we inherit a sinful nature; we are without true fear or faith in God. But while we were still sinners, Christ died for us! He exchanged His life for our sin. And in baptism He imparts His righteousness and births in us new life. Let us remember what baptism means for our daily life:

Baptism means that the sinful nature in us should be drowned by daily sorrow and repentance, and that all its evil deeds and desires be put to death. It also means that a new person should daily arise to life before, with, and in God.

So as baptized children we confess our sins:

Holy and gracious Father, I am sinful by nature and have sinned against you in my thoughts, words and actions. I have not loved you with my whole heart nor loved others as myself, the two things you commanded. I stand condemned. But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins on the cross, rescuing me from this condemnation. So we humbly ask, God have mercy on me.

Hear the words of absolution: your sins are forgiven. Go now and sin no more. Amen

## ▼ BAPTISM

In Matthew (28:19) Jesus instructed us to baptize in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

In John (3:5) Jesus told us that the entry into God's Kingdom is being born again through water and the Spirit.

In Mark (10:13-16) Jesus blessed the children and held them up as a model for faith.

In Acts (2:38-39) this promise is explicitly stated to be for children as well as adults.

So, this morning, we come in obedience to the command of Christ and trust in the promise of God, that what we do here is of supreme importance.

By presenting James for Holy Baptism, you commit yourselves to providing for his growth in the knowledge and fear of the Lord. This includes placing in his hands the Holy Scriptures, teaching him the Ten Commandments, the Lord's Prayer and the Creed. Is that your intention?

## Yes, by the help of God.

Do you renounce all the forces of evil? **We renounce them.** 

Do you renounce the devil? **We renounce him.** 

Do you renounce all the devil's empty promises? **We renounce them.** 

Let us profess together the faith in which we baptize as expressed in the Apostle's Creed:

I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen

James Martin Kanode, you are baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. We thank you, O Lord, for freeing your sons and daughters from the power of sin and for raising them up to new life through this holy sacrament. Pour out your Holy Spirit upon James, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence. Amen.

James, child of God, you are marked with the sign of the cross and sealed with God's Holy Spirit. Amen.

Receive this candle as a way to remember and celebrate this day and may it serve as a reminder that we are all called to let the light of Christ shine through us in a way that draws others to God and gives glory to our Lord and Savior. Jesus the Christ.
