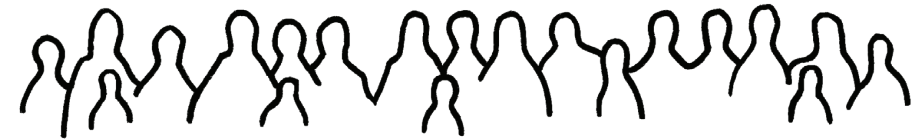

August 2, 2020

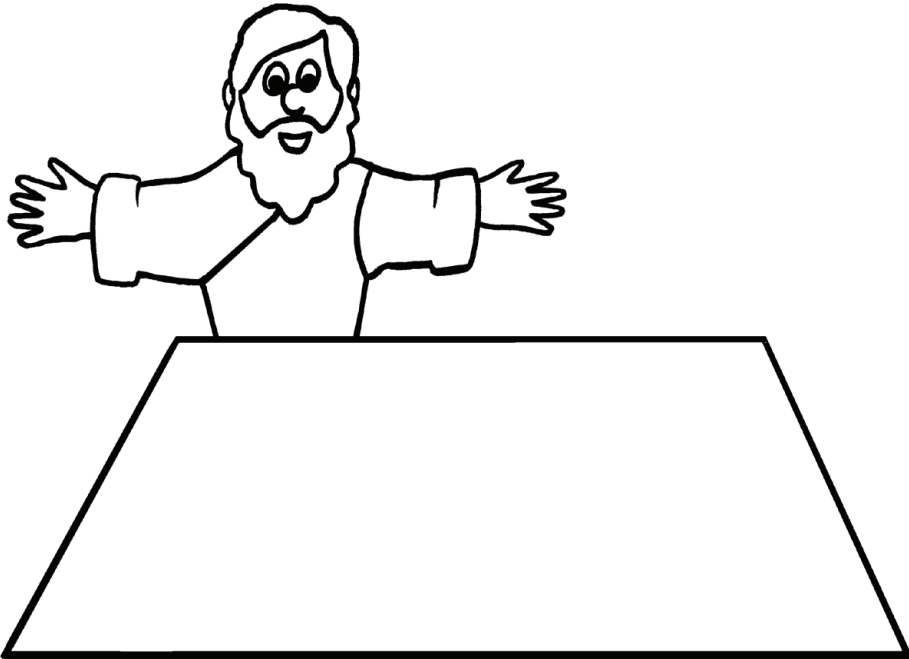


With just 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish, Jesus fed more than 5,000 people. It was a miracle!

Then, draw yourself sitting beside Jesus!*



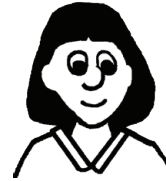
Jesus said: "Come, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters;
